

Dane County Project 25 Unit Identification Plan

The State of Wisconsin has established a plan for Project 25 digital radio unit IDs. This is the identification number that is programmed into the radio and can be decoded by receiving units. The purpose of the plan is to provide a logical plan for the assignment of unique radio identifiers to all potential Project 25 digital capable radios used by public safety agencies within the State of Wisconsin. The goal of the plan is to eliminate use of duplicate identifiers and maximize the benefit of the imbedded unit ID capability through the use of a number that is logically defined. This number can be tied to an alphanumeric display.

The unit identifier consists of 7 numbers (in decimal format).

A B The first 2 digits will denote the county that the radio is based in or, for state and federal radios, the agency that owns it. Dane County radios will use “13”, in accordance with state plans.

C The third digit is a prefix to differentiate between radios within a county that have the same unit number or radio call number, such as a mobile and portable assigned to an individual officer, or type of agencies.

DE A municipality code based on current law enforcement radio call prefixes and per the attached agency list.

- Towns, other communities (Rockdale) or agencies not connected with an existing code will be assigned ID numbers by Dane County upon request.
- Border community agencies (examples include Edgerton, likely to use Rock County prefixes; Brooklyn, where the PD uses a Green County ORI, etc.) may use prefixes based on another county as mutually agreed by Dane and the other County.
- Agencies serving multiple communities will use the code associated with the primary city of village (example: Cottage Grove PD should use the village 8200 numbers; Brooklyn FD/EMS would use the village 6300 numbers or alternately Green County-based numbers given the station location) or the community in which they are primarily administered (example: Fitch-Rona EMS would use Fitchburg 6400 numbers).

FG The unit ID of the vehicle, officer or person that the radio is assigned to, or the radio. These digits are normally assigned by the local agency, and reported to Dane County. Dane County will assign these digits for towns or other agencies not connected with an existing municipality code.

Legacy Motorola 800 MHz SmartNet IDs can continue to be used by dual-band radios on the City of Madison system, but the 07xxxxxx style Motorola numbers will generally not be used on the VHF P25 system.
