The Region 13 RCRC has approved the STARRS adjacent state request as it pertains to the below listed frequency resources contained in the State of Illinois Letter of Concurrence (LOC) addressing the licensing of 800 MHz frequencies in Jefferson, St. Charles and St. Louis Counties, Missouri as follows:

Jefferson County, North, channels 24, 76, 108, 176, and 228
Jefferson County, South, channels 36, 63, and 226
St. Charles County, North channels 33, 62, 110, 148, 185, 187, and 224
St. Charles County, South channels 31, and 188
St. Louis County, North channels 70, 106, 146, 177, 186, 227, and 229
St. Louis County, South channels 35, 73, 100, 149, 184 and 225

Region 13 fully supports Jefferson, St. Charles and St. Louis Counties efforts to construct a wide area interoperable network and concurs with your request to license the above named channels, contingent upon receipt of completed FCC 601 applications which reflect final system design as agreed upon in our working meeting of November 30, 2011, and final Region 13 vote conducted via phone conference 08:30 AM, December 22, 2011, in which the vote to approve was unanimous. Any changes to the referenced applications and/or subsequent licenses are subject to the commission's rules governing modifications, 47 C.F.R.90.135, and will require further review.

The State of Illinois LOC was provided with the condition that Jefferson, St. Charles and St. Louis Counties will be responsible for making every effort to avoid interfering with incumbent licensed systems. Should objectionable interference occur, Jefferson, St. Charles, and St. Louis Counties will immediately correct the problem to the satisfaction of incumbent licensee(s). We further trust that if no immediate remedy is found, Jefferson, St. Charles, and St. Louis Counties will discontinue operations on the interfering frequency until such remedy is found.
